<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Smart, tailored trouser or skirt suit or shift dress. Can include patterns such as stripes or checks. Chinos are also permitted• Smart shirt or blouse (subtle pattern permitted)• Jackets required for assemblies and formal occasions• Plain fitted jumper or neat quarter zip (single colour with small logo only)• Navy or black tights	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Earrings should be studs or small hoops• No facial piercings unless for cultural or religious reasons• Skirt mid-thigh length (tailored, no T-shirt/ jersey material)• Black, navy, or brown formal leather shoes• Tie to be worn with a shirt
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A Sixth Form tie for formal events and Mondays (details to follow in September)

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Must always be wearing a Dunottar branded top (white or senior sports)• Black sports leggings or trousers (minimal branding)• Suitable footwear for sport and physical activity. No fashion trainers to be worn• Those competing in competitive sport must wear suitable Dunottar team kit• Dorking kit can be worn on match days
