

Sixth Form Dress Code

Our Sixth Form dress code allows individuality whilst reflecting current business attire in the workplace.

Uniform	Guidelines
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Smart trousers, dress, skirt or suit • Smart shirt or blouse, fitted jumper or top with short / long sleeves • Smart shirt / polo shirt and formal jumper / 1/4 zip jumper • Smart shoes or boots (loafers or single/subtle colour fashion style sneakers (no sports trainers/Air Force Ones) • Jackets (and ties for boys) required for assemblies and formal occasions 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Earrings should be studs or small hoops • No facial piercings unless for cultural or religious reasons • Dress and skirt length should be closer to the knee than to the hip (tailored, no t-shirt/ jersey material) • No open-toed shoes e.g. flip-flops or sandals • No sports trainers • Jeans are acceptable if they are plain and of a dark colour. No fading, rips or large pockets • No sports shirts, large logos or branding (small logos on polo shirts or jumpers are acceptable) • No vest tops, low cut tops or crop tops • No oversized or baggy jumpers

The final decision about what is or is not acceptable rests with the Director and Deputy Head of Sixth Form. If a student is unsure whether a piece of clothing is acceptable or not, it should not be worn. A student who is in school and not dressed according to this code will be asked to make appropriate changes.

Sportswear

- Must wear a navy blue Dunottar-branded top
- Black sports leggings or trousers (minimal branding)
- Suitable footwear for sport and physical activity. No fashion trainers to be worn (e.g. Air Force trainers)
- Those competing in competitive sport must wear suitable Dunottar team kit
- Dorking kit can be worn on match days for those in the Dorking Wanderers programme
